504 Plan is a document developed to help a child who has a disability identified under the law. This plan implements accommodations to better help serve the child in the school setting.

- This plan falls under the Section 504 of the U.S. Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which is a federal civil rights law to stop discrimination against people with disabilities.

How do I know if my child is eligible?

- If your child has any disability including a learning disability, ADHD, anxiety, etc. that interferes with your child's ability to learn in the general education classroom.

Who creates this plan and what are some of the accommodations?

- This plan may be developed by your child's teacher, principal, special education teacher, and/or school psychologist.
- Examples of accommodations include:
 - Preferential seating
 - Extended time on tests
 - Reduced homework
 - Development of a behavior plan
 - Small group setting for taking tests
 - Learning in small groups or one on one

IEP (Individualized Education Plan) is created when a child is in need of special education services. This plan provides individualized services to meet the specific child's needs.

- The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act is a federal special education law for children with disabilities.
- An IEP is more specialized than a 504 Plan.

How do I know if my child is eligible?

- Your child has one or more specific disabilities, which can include, but not limited to:
 - Learning disability
 - ADHD
 - Autism
 - Hearing, visual, or speech impairment
 - Developmental delay

Who creates this plan and what is in the plan?

- There are legal requirements about who develops the IEP. The team usually includes the parent, teacher, special education teacher, school psychologist, and principal.
- What the plan can consist of:
 - Specific educational goals
 - Enrollment in special education classes
 - Expectations of material learned may be changed
 - How your child participates in standardized tests
